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PURPOSE

To provide guidelines for the prohibition of the use of parolees as informants, undercover agents, or employees of any law enforcement agency of the state or any political subdivision.

GENERAL

It is the policy of the agency and the Board of Parole to prohibit the use of parolees as informants, undercover agents, or employees of any state law enforcement agency or political subdivision. It is also the policy of the agency to extend such prohibition to other law enforcement agencies.

PROCEDURES

- I. Adult Parole Administration staff shall prohibit parolees under their supervision from acting as an informant, agent or employee for any federal, state or local law enforcement agency or political subdivision in accordance with their signed parole agreement.
- II. Whenever a supervising parole officer becomes aware that a parolee is acting in a capacity prohibited in section I above, the officer will immediately direct the parolee to stop such action; that to proceed would be a violation of the conditions of his/her parole. The supervising officer shall submit a written report to the appropriate Supervisor describing the situation as soon as reasonably possible.
 - A. The Supervisor shall contact the agency involved and upon confirmation of the information, advise the agency that such action is contrary to the conditions of the offender's parole. The district supervisor will then submit a report to the Adult Parole Administrator or designee.
 - B. The Adult Parole Administrator or designee will review the report, clarify any information and submit a report to the Deputy Director for Programs and Community Services who will then advise the Director of the situation. After such review, the Adult Parole Administrator will implement directives issued by the Director or Deputy Director of Programs and Community Services.
- III. This prohibition does not extend to parolee participation in law enforcement agency public service projects provided that the parolee's participation is voluntary and has been approved by the appropriate district supervisor, the Adult Parole Administrator, the Deputy Director for Programs, and Community Services and the Board of Parole.
